Will I still be assessed on my ATAR?

We're not sure yet if the application process will be based on ATAR like in previous years. But we think you should keep studying hard and working toward your future like you've always planned.

When will University start in 2021?

Semester 1 2021 at La Trobe will be delayed as needed. So don't stress if your ATAR comes late. We can start the Semester a bit later if we need to.

What pathway options does La Trobe have?

We have the Aspire Early Admissions Program that rewards you for being involved in leadership or volunteer work in your school or community. Successful applicants receive an early conditional offer to La Trobe, so you could know early on if there's a spot for you in your dream course.

We look at all types of community work so if you think you may be eligible, we encourage you to apply. Applications open on 1 May 2020.

We also have other pathways that can lead to your desired course. So if you don't meet the entry requirements for your dream course, generally there are pathways that may lead you to that course in future. Pathways are course specific and some may be more competitive than others.

How do I apply for Aspire?

You can apply online through the application form. We'll ask you to tell us a bit about your volunteer work and which La Trobe courses you'd like to be considered for.

Where can I stay informed about VCE updates?

We'll continue to send regular updates to your school so we recommend you keep in contact with your Career Practitioners. You can also visit our website for regular updates.

Will I have to study online?

It will depend on whether the government relaxes COVID-19 restrictions. At the moment our courses and learning support services are being delivered online.

Our priority is to keep students and staff safe and to comply with Government advice. We'll keep monitoring the COVID-19 situation and move classes back to campus when it's safe to do so.
